



- 4. Exhibitors/Owners must have current Public Liability insurance, min \$10 million covering the 2024 Mullumbimby Show period. Certificate of Currency must accompany entry form.
- 5. All stud stock must either be registered or eligible to be registered with their respective Breed Societies & have registered name of entry form.
- 6. Cows in stud breed classes 3 years & over must be in calf or show signs of having been a breeder.
- 7. Bulls over 12 months old must have a nose ring which is to be used at all times.
- 8. Bulls over 6 months must be penned or tied up immediately upon entering the showgound.
- 9. All entries must be received by 5.00pm on the 1st November 2025 no entries will be accepted after this time or on the day.
- Only 1st prize animals can compete for Champion. Animals over 20 months can compete for Senior Champion.
- 11. If doubt arises in the mind of the Judge or Judges in any class as to classification of a competing animal, the matter will be referred to the Chief Steward for consideration.
