This years Pavilion Theme is Honey Bees. These miracle workers play a big part in pollinating close to 75% of the world's crop producing fruit and seeds for human consumption depend on pollinators for sustained production, yield and quality.

In the past honey was only considered a sweetener, whereas today, we know that it contains many beneficial substances. It is an excellent nutrient and calmativ. Owing to it's antibacterial and antioxidant properties.

Honey does not require additional processing and a beekeeper does not add anything nor take anything away from it. While mature honey loses some of it's nutritional value, it still remains a superior sweetener for many decades, especially compared to plain sugar.

Honey can be mixed into different drinks, for example tea, milk, yoghurt or natural juices. It can be added to various baked or cooked dishes (cakes, sauces, vegetables, meats), usually to infuse them with it's special aroma.

So get buzzing and lets see what you can create with your honey.

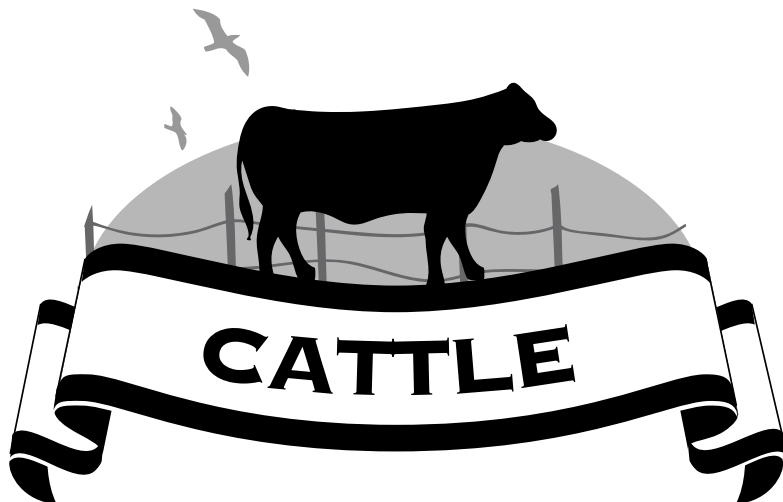

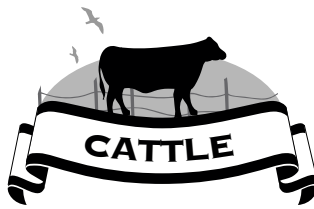

5. All stud stock must be either registered or eligible to be registered with their respective Breed Societies & have registered name on entry form.
6. Cows in stud beef classes 3 years & over must be in calf or show signs of having been a breeder
7. Bulls over 12 months must have a nose ring which is to be used at all times
8. Bulls over 6 months must be penned or tied up immediately upon entering the showground.
9. All entries must be received by 5pm on 5th November 2022 - no entries will be accepted on the day
10. Only 1st prize animals can compete for Champion. Animals over the age of 20 months can compete for Senior Champion. Animals placed 2nd in a class of the animal placed Champion can compete for award or Reserve Champion

- Two warnings for rule infringements or inappropriate behaviour will be given. A third infringement will result in disqualification
- Footwear with any form of studs or spikes is forbidden and may result in disqualification.
 - All teams must be ready at 9.45 for a 10am start
- All members must remain on their feet. No hands are allowed to be persistently on the ground apart from the anchorman who is allowed to keep one hand on the ground.
- Lots will be drawn to establish opponents in the first round. The judge will toss a coin with the captains to establish the direction of pull.
- Before pulling the judge will order teams to "Pick up the rope". The judge will then ask both teams if they are ready then give the order "Take the strain", at this point the teams should heel in and pull the rope tight. The judge will make sure that the teams are centered over the starting mark and, when they are balanced, the order "Pull" will be given.

SAFETY 1. Wrapping the rope around a limb can result in a broken bone and loss of blood flow. Wrapping the rope around the body can cause severe internal injuries. 2. Spiked or studded footwear can cause injury if a pull collapse. They may also cause stains and breaks if a competitor's feet become stuck in the ground. 3. Gloves and a thick cotton shirt should be worn to help avoid rope burns.
