When I was growing up, we (me and my cousins) would go to Nan's every Friday afternoon, we called it "Cake Day". Nans was an amazing cook, usually no recipe book, it was all by memory. Some of her favourites were Jelly Sponge, Scones, Mushroom Tarts and Sand Cake just to name a few. It is one of my best childhood memories.





- 6. Cows in stud breed classes 3 years & over must be in calf or show signs of having been a breeder.
- 7. Bulls over 12 months old must have a nose ring which is to be used at all times.
- 8. Bulls over 6 months must be penned or tied up immediately upon entering the showgound.
- 9. All entries must be received by 5.00pm on the 4th November 2023 no entries will be accepted after this time or on the day.
- 10. Only 1st prize animals can compete for Champion. Animals over 20 months can compete for Senior Champion.

- All teams must have four members.
- All team members must be over 18.
- Teams must nominate one member as a captain.
- All competitors must sign appropriate ASC Participation Waiver
- Two warnings for rule infringements or inappropriate behaviour will be given. A third infringement will result in disqualification
- Footwear with any form of studs or spikes is forbidden and may result in disqualification.
- All members must remain on their feet. No hands are allowed to be persistently on the ground apart from the anchorman who is allowed to keep one hand on the ground.
- Lots will be drawn to establish opponents in the first round. The judge will toss a coin with the captains to establish the direction of pull.

• Before pulling the judge will order teams to "Pick up the rope". The judge will then ask both teams if they are ready then give the order "Take the strain", at this point the teams should heel in and pull the rope tight. The judge will make sure that the teams are centered over the starting mark and, when they are balanced, the order "Pull" will be given.

SAFETY 1. Wrapping the rope around a limb can result in a broken bone and loss of blood flow. Wrapping the rope around the body can cause severe internal injuries. 2. Spiked or studded footwear can cause injury if a pull collapse. They may also cause stains and breaks if a competitor's feet become stuck in the ground. 3. Gloves and a thick cotton shirt should be worn to help avoid rope burns.
